Words taken from the chapel designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago. Now restored, the Tiffany Chapel is on display in The Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art, Winter Park, Orlando, Florida.
